

they fell in love with our house the first time they saw it and how much they looked forward to raising their kids in it. I hope they are as blessed in it as we were.

Fortunately, Karen and I are just as enthusiastic about our new home. Except I miss a very important improvement that we had made to the old house that is not in the new house: 'zoned' heating and cooling control.

In our old house it didn't matter whether you were on the main floor, the upstairs levels, or the basement - the temperature was comfortable. It could be 90 degrees outside and be just as cool upstairs as it was on the main floor - whichever end of the house you were at. And the basement would also be a steady 70 degrees - which was important because it was finished and we had an entertainment center there.

The same was true in

freezing cold weather: every floor was comfortable. That was because with 'zoning' there is an independent thermostat on each floor. One in our upstairs master bedroom, one in the finished basement, and two thermostats on the main floor - one on the north end of the house for the dining room and living room and a separate one on the south end for the family room.

It was a rude awakening for us in our new house, which, while lovely, has a cold master bedroom, a freezing office if we close the door, and our finished basement is so cold it could be a meat locker.

In our cars we have separate heating and cooling controls for the driver, the front passenger and the rear passengers. So why do we put up with an uncomfortable home?

So my top home project is to fix this. Part of it I solved immediately by getting rid of the

beautiful but very restrictive wooden supply register grills and replacing them with metal ones with good air flow. Part of it will be solved by putting a larger heat run to my office and an extra supply run to the master bedroom. But the biggest improvement will be 5 separate thermostats: in the master bedroom, my office, the main floor, the finished basement, and in a separate basement bedroom for guests.

With the technology that is available today, zoning a house is about a day's job and very little mess. I am looking forward to reclaiming the finished basement and making it comfortable. It will double the livable space in the house. Zoning is the only way I know to add more useful square footage to a house without putting on an addition.
